
# Hymn: 557 Praise to the Holiest in the height

That You continue to hold all things in the
hollow of Your hand
That Your great love and tender care are
bestowed upon the frailest of Your
creatures.

In Your mighty work of creation You never lose sight of the least of Your children:

Those sick in mind and in body;
Those oppressed and downtrodden;
Those who are hungry naked and cold;
Those who struggle and those who despair;

Those who suffer and those who die alone and uncomforted.

You who hold the stars in being, hold these children closest to Your heart.
